Working Out Our Free Salvation

Therefore, my dear friends, as you have always obeyed — not only in my presence, but now much more in my absence — continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling. — Philippians 2:12 NIV

This is part of the Apostle Paul's message to the church in Philippi, words which may confuse those of us who believe God's gift of salvation is free; you cannot work for or earn something that's free. But before I continue, here's another version this passage from The Amplified Bible (it's not louder...it's more detailed!)

So then, my dear ones, just as you have always obeyed [my instructions with enthusiasm], not only in my presence, but now much more in my absence, continue to work out your salvation [that is, cultivate it, bring it to full effect, actively pursue spiritual maturity] with awe-inspired fear and trembling [using serious caution and critical self-evaluation to avoid anything that might offend God or discredit the name of Christ]. — Philippians 2:12 AMP

The bracketed words are added by the editors in an effort to better explain each verse. Now I believe the message is much obvious: working out our salvation is to cultivate it; to actively pursue spiritual maturity; to grow in our Christlikeness. By "working it out" we are not earning it; it's still God's gift to us. And note that Paul's message is for the entire congregation. He's asking the congregation to work diligently and communally to help grow God's Kingdom.

During Advent, there was a bulletin insert each Sunday that listed four questions:

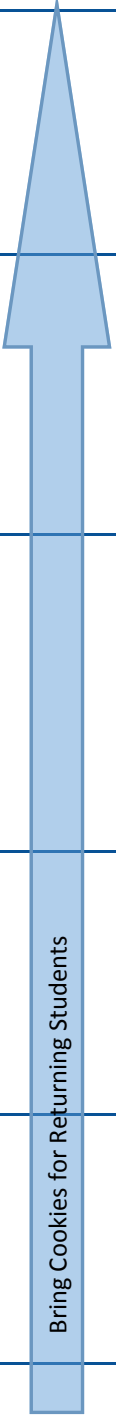
